

General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) - Article 27

[...] Where Article 3(2) applies, the controller or the processor shall designate in writing a representative in the Union. [...] [link to Article 27](#) ...

The GDPR does apply to companies outside of the EU:

- You have to work GDPR compliant if you are in any business relationship with EU-citizens and residents.
- This means beside other regulations that you shall name a representative who is EU inhabitant and able to represent your enterprise to EU data protection authorities ([GDPR, Art. 27](#)).
- In the case you are data processor or dealing with data processors and part of the common task is processing data of EU inhabitants you shall not do that without a valid agreement which secures a safe and compliant way of data processing ([GDPR, Art. 28](#)).

Of course there is more to do – but this is a very basic overview on your mandatory tasks.
